## Signing in for Mass

Signing in for Mass is no longer legally required -although still strongly encouraged in order to provide information for Test & Protect. From next weekend you will be asked to sign yourself in, rather than have your details taken by an usher. Since there is a possibility that your details will be seen by others on the sign-in sheet, you may wish, instead, to leave a piece of paper with your name and contact telephone number in the collection box. There will also be posters with a QR code in the porch, for those who wish to use their mobile phones to sign in. I sincerely hope that this will make us all feel that we are "getting back to normal".

## 11am Solemn Mass

Most Sundays, the *Ordinary of the Mass* (Lord, have mercy, Gloria, Holy, holy & Lamb of God) are sung in Latin. These texts can be found in the hymn book (no. 633). You are warmly encouraged to join in as you learn the chants. The Our Father will be sung in Latin until we are familiar with it.

The words, for your convenience, are as follows:

*Pater noster, qui es in caelis:  
sanctificetur nomen tuum.*

*Advéniat regnum tuum.*

*Fiat volúntas tua, sicut in caelo, et in terra.*

*Panem nostrum quotidiánum da nobis hódie,  
et dimítte nobis débíta nostra,*

*sicut et nos dimítimus debitóribus nostris.*

*Et ne nos indúcas in tentatiónem.*

*Sed libera nos a malo.*

*Our Father, who art in heaven:  
hallowed be thy name.*

*Thy kingdom come.*

*Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven.*

*Give us this day our daily bread,  
and forgive us our trespasses,*

*as we forgive those who trespass against us.*

*And lead us not into temptation.*

*But deliver us from evil.*

## Church Grounds

Donald did a wonderful job maintaining our gardens, and for several years. He decided last year, however, that he was not in a position to continue assisting us. I should like to thank him once again on behalf of the entire Parish for all that he did for St Brigid's.

That left the gardens largely unattended, and the results were clear to us all. Although telephone calls of complaint were aplenty, offers of help (save one or two) were not forthcoming. We are immensely grateful to SANCTUARY SCOTLAND for the recent tidy-up. I think we can all see the difference- and now remember what the grounds ought to look like.

Sanctuary has offered future help with things such as the hedges, but it is important to remember that the Parish grounds are the responsibility primarily of the *parishioners of St Brigid's* and not outside agencies- no matter how grateful we are of their assistance. A property of this size would cost a lot of money to maintain professionally- money we just don't have and, although I am more than happy to roll up my sleeves when required, the Archbishop of Glasgow appointed me to St Brigid's more for Sacramental work than for gardening.

In order that the state of the gardens does not deteriorate to that extent again, we urgently need volunteers to help cut the grass, do occasional weeding or leaf collecting, prune the bushes etc. Without the help of those whose Parish St Brigid's is, the gardens will simply deteriorate again- to the detriment of the whole of Toryglen.
