Most Sundays, the *Ordinary of the Mass* (Lord, have mercy, Gloria, Holy, holy & Lamb of God) are sung in Latin. These texts can be found in the hymn book (no. 633). The Our Father will be also be sung in Latin. The words, for you convenience, are as follows:

Sed libera nos a malo.*
