

Sex Education in our Catholic Schools- VERY important!

Immediate action requested: respond to Scottish Government consultation on new RSHP Guidance. Closing date 23rd November 2023

The Scottish Government has published draft Guidance on Sex Education in both secondary and primary schools (referred to as "Relationships, Sexual Health & Parenthood" education or "RSHP"). You can find it here (go to the online bulletin online to click on the link):

It proposes BIG and SERIOUS changes to our Catholic schools. Please read it.

A key proposed change is the **removal of the right of the Catholic Church to determine the sex education curriculum in Catholic schools.** For many years now, the content of sex education in Catholic state schools has been determined by the Catholic Church. We teach sex education <u>within a</u> <u>Catholic moral context</u>, in order that our children are not exposed to the extreme, graphic content that is available to children in non-denominational schools.

Previously, the Scottish Government's written Guidance has supported the right of the Church to determine the content of the sex education curriculum in Catholic schools.

This new draft Guidance removes that

right. Thus, the draft Guidance seeks to "embed lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) inclusive education across the curriculum" for Catholic schools as well as nondenominational schools.

The Bishops' Conference made the following statement on 8th November:

"The Bishops' Conference of Scotland is both disappointed and confused at the decision by the Scottish Government to delete all reference to Catholic schools in its: Guidance on the Delivery of Relationships, Sexual Health and Parenthood (RSHP) Education in Scottish Schools" document. We strongly request the re-insertion of the paragraphs relating to Denominational Education from the previous iteration of the guidance, which would reflect both the legal protection for schools with a Religious Character, and the previously supportive position of Scottish Government for Catholic schools."

It is vitally important that the Catholics speak with a strong and united voice in responding to this consultation before the closing date of the **23rd November**.
