Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon Catholics from age 14 onwards.

The Mass schedule for Ash Wednesday is:
10am (church), 1.30pm (school),
7pm (church- Latin)

Sacraments for Children 2024

First Confession and First Communion are made by application to the parish. The following is necessary:

1. Your child has been baptised
2. You and your child have been attending Sunday Mass in St Brigid's for six months or more
3. You have already spoken to Fr Byrne
4. The school have been informed that you have applied to the parish
5. Your child has completed two "All Stars" catechism club sessions in the parish

Remaining All Stars' dates are as follows:

First Confession: 21st, 22nd, 28th, 29th February
First Communion: 13th, 14th, 20th, 21st March
